Leo Norred and Boat Ramp Parks Improvement.

Keith Myers, Jane Fedosky, and I met with Butch Hendrick, Okaloosa County Facilities and Parks Maintenance Director and his assistant Amanda Maxwell. We showed some them some areas of interest with both Leo Norred and Poquito Bayou Boat Ramp Parks. We showed areas of concerns at each park. On April 21st, Butch sent me a list of action items with estimated completion dates!

Leo Norred Park. Our focus was safety. The rubber matting is worn or breaking apart in the children's playground area. I asked for some parking posts on the left side of the parking area, identical to what the county had built on the right side of the parking area. This is to keep motorized vehicles out of the park. I asked for NO Pets/Vehicles signs. Over the years, I've seen an uptick in the number of pets in Leo Norred Park. Keep in mind these pets were on leashes and their owners were keeping an eye on them. Since Leo Norred Park is a county park, there's a county ordinance prohibiting pets in county parks. My biggest fear during a PBCA-sponsored event that a child may get too close to a pet and may get bitten. I've been told by law enforcement officers that signs need to be in place allowing the enforcement of an ordinance. Butch and Amanda noticed that we didn't have a county sign, so one will be set up.

We asked for extra benches (identical to the ones the county added back in 2008) on the side of the children's playground area for parents to have a place to sit and stop children from making a break for Poplar Ave.

Since the inception of PBCA, we've had an ongoing agreement with the county that we would maintain Leo Norred Park with very little assistance from the county. The last major capital improvement by the county was done back in 2008/2009 when the playground equipment, swings, gazebo, sidewalks and port-a-jon was put in. The extra benches, parking posts, playground padding and the No Dog/Motorized Vehicle signs, should take care of our safety-related capital improvements for the near term. This doesn't affect our agreement with the county.



He will continue to help CERT. Bill Miller is taking a break from taking care of Leo Norred Park. Bill took over this important position when Gary Colsch died two years ago. Bill has done an outstanding job maintaining Leo Norred Park!!! We're going to miss Bill. We welcome his return. I've asked Matt Murphy, a local landscaper who lives on Birch to take over Leo Norred Park. We welcome Matt to the PBCA Board.

In closing, I want to reflect on events that took place two years ago. Our association president Gary Colsch had passed away. Poquito Bayou Boat Ramp Park. Many of the improvement suggestions came from Keith Myers' Boat Ramp Committee. Many signs will be replaced and/or repaired. All signs are safety related (parking, sidewalk, etc.). The "Restoration in Progress" signs out in the water will be removed. We asked for the county to take care of some erosion from a concrete slab they removed months ago. The handicap parking slot will be improved and possibly have two slots. More gravel will be added along Bay Street going down to the park to take care of some erosion. The parking lot will be repaved and restriped. There is a proposal for a kayak launch area and jet ski slides. Another retention pond will be built for low lying areas. The county will be working with the Choctawhatchee Basin Alliance (CBA).

Finally, in conjunction with the Corps of Engineers, they plan to add more "No Wake" area signs, like that in Hands Cove.. Keep in mind with the new dock extension that is currently being built, these improvements will make Poquito Bayou Boat Ramp Park a better county

Hurricane Season is Just Around the Corner

Alright everyone, 'tis the season once again. Unfortunately, I am not referring to any upcoming holiday season with festivities, I am talking about hurricane season. It is almost time to start restocking and taking inventory of your supplies that may be needed during an emergency. Many of us used up some of our supplies during the pandemic, so make sure that anything you may have used is replenished. I'll once again repeat what I have said in the past inasmuch as many families in the neighborhood have been for quite some time, know what to plan for and know what to expect during hurricane season; however, no matter how experienced you are, it is always a good idea to review and look over supplies and your household emergency plan.

I'll rehash what I sent out last year as a reminder and lay out the basics. Whether or not an evacuation is required, basic supplies that can last at least 72 hours may help in the event of an emergency. I pulled some information off of <https://www.ready.gov/build-a-kit> just to give a refresher of what an emergency kit can consist of; however, feel free to visit the site for more information. Basically, everyone's needs are different, and your kit should be adjusted to meet your own requirements; moreover, I am sure that we have all discovered new items that we would rather not do without if we can help it.

- Water - one gallon of water per person per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation
- Food - at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert
- Flashlight
- First aid kit
- Extra batteries
- Whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Manual can opener for canned food
- Local maps

- Cell phone with chargers and a backup battery
- Consider adding the following items to your emergency supply kit based on your individual needs:
- Of course, TOILET PAPER and hand sanitizer, which are apparently good for all types of emergencies to include pandemics.
 - Prescription medications
 - Non-prescription medications such as pain relievers, anti-diarrhea medication, antacids or laxatives
 - Glasses and contact lenses solution
 - Infant formula, bottles, diapers, wipes, diaper rash cream
 - Pet food and extra water for your pet
 - Cash or traveler's checks
 - Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account records saved electronically or in a waterproof, portable container
 - Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person
 - Complete change of clothing appropriate for your climate and sturdy shoes
 - Household chlorine bleach and medicine dropper to disinfect water
 - Fire extinguisher
 - Matches in a waterproof container
 - Feminine supplies and personal hygiene items
 - Mess kits, paper cups, plates, paper towels and plastic utensils
 - Paper and pencil
 - Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children

By now, I am sure that you are all pretty familiar with what you need as a family to get by in isolation and these are just guidelines. **Bottom line--don't get caught at the last minute without something you need, as the stores may be empty by that time or you may be more concerned with packing up or hunkering down to go shopping!**

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
